


Choose one book from the list and complete one of the following projects.
All projects need to include: Your name, Class, Title of Book, Author of Book

Project Options:

<p>Write a New Ending/the Next Chapter</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write 1-3 page new ending (or a first chapter to a sequel) to the book you read. The new chapter should contain the same characters, style, setting, plot, problem (conflict), and theme (message about life) of the book. Make a cover sheet of your new ending that illustrates a scene from your chapter. On your cover sheet, include the title of the book you read, the author's name, and your first and last name. 	
<p>Write a Main Idea Summary Essay</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write a 1-2 page essay that summarizes the main ideas in the book that you read. A 3-paragraph essay should have: 1) an introduction about the book you read that includes why you chose it, and how you felt about the main character and events. 2) an explanation of what the main lesson/moral of the story is. 3) a conclusion stating whether you'd recommend the book or not, and why (strengths and weaknesses of the book). Make a cover sheet that represents the main ideas, characters, and themes (messages about life) of the book you read. Include the title of the book, the author's name, and your first and last name on your cover sheet. 	
<p>Dramatic Scene or Trailer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Select a scene or scenes from the novel and write a script. Act out and videotape (One to two minutes in length) or create two GoAnimate.com movies. You can also use iMovie or moviemaker (app on Chromebook) 	<p>Create a Caricature</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Draw or use "SP-Studio" http://www.sp-studio.de/index.htm Choose a character and a scene/chapter Describe the scene, character's physical traits, and personality traits Include a quote or passage from the story.
<p>Soundtrack</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Find a song which you think reflects the themes in the book. Write liner notes explaining how the song or piece of music reflects something about the important messages of the novel or how it fits a certain scene. 	<p>Theme Collage</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose one or several prominent themes from the text Create a collage of images that represent these themes. On the back of the collage, provide explanations for at least five of your images.
<p>"Word Clouds"</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Select themes, character traits, events or combinations Use wordle.net to create a "word cloud" or create your own graffiti-like work On the back of the Wordle, provide explanations for seven of your words. 	<p>Design a New Book Cover / Movie Poster</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use thematic ideas or parts from the book Illustrate your cover or poster In an attached essay, explain what your book cover means and why your design is better.

<p><i>The River</i> Gary Paulsen</p> 	<p>"We want you to do it again." These words, spoken to Brian Robeson, will change his life. Two years earlier, Brian was stranded alone in the wilderness for fifty-four days with nothing but a small hatchet. Yet he survived. Now the government wants him to do it again -- to go back into the wilderness so that astronauts and the military can learn the survival techniques that kept Brian alive.</p>				
<p><i>Esperanza Rising</i> Pamela Munoz Ryan</p> 	<p>Esperanza thought she'd always live with her family on their ranch in Mexico--she'd always have fancy dresses, a beautiful home, and servants. But a sudden tragedy forces Esperanza and Mama to flee to California during the Great Depression, and to settle in a camp for Mexican farm workers. Esperanza isn't ready for the hard labor, financial struggles, or lack of acceptance she now faces. When their new life is threatened, Esperanza must find a way to rise above her difficult circumstances--Mama's life, and her own, depend on it.</p>				
<p><i>The War that Saved My Life</i> Kimberly Brubaker Bradley</p> 	<p>Nine-year-old Ada has never left her one-room apartment. Her mother is too humiliated by Ada's twisted foot to let her outside. So when her little brother Jamie is shipped out of London to escape the war, Ada doesn't waste a minute—she sneaks out to join him. So begins a new adventure of Ada, and for Susan Smith, the woman who is forced to take the two kids in. As Ada teaches herself to ride a pony, learns to read, and watches for German spies, she begins to trust Susan—and Susan begins to love Ada and Jamie. But in the end, will their bond be enough to hold them together through wartime? Or will Ada and her brother fall back into the cruel hands of their mother?</p>				
<p><i>The Land of Stories</i> Chris Colfer</p> 	<p>Alex and Conner Bailey's world is about to change, in this fast-paced adventure that uniquely combines our modern day world with the enchanting realm of classic fairy tales. <i>The Land of Stories</i> tells the tale of twins Alex and Conner. Through the mysterious powers of a cherished book of stories, they leave their world behind and find themselves in a foreign land full of wonder and magic where they come face-to-face with the fairy tale characters they grew up reading about. But after a series of encounters with witches, wolves, goblins, and trolls alike, getting back home is going to be harder than they thought.</p>

<p>Any Title/Series by Rick Riordan</p> 	<p>Percy Jackson Series - Twelve-year-old Percy Jackson is on the most dangerous quest of his life, to journey across the United States to catch a thief who has stolen the original weapon of mass destruction. Along the way, he must face a host of mythological enemies determined to stop him.</p> <p>Kane Chronicles - Carter and Sadie are brought together by their father, Dr. Kane, for a "research experiment" and unleashes the Egyptian god Set, who banishes him to oblivion and forces the children to flee for their lives. To stop him, they must embark on a dangerous journey across the globe—a quest that brings them ever closer to the truth about their family, and their links to a secret order that has existed since the time of the pharaohs.</p> <p>Heroes of Olympus - Jason has a problem. He doesn't remember anything before waking up on a school bus holding hands with a girl. Apparently she's his girlfriend Piper, his best friend is a kid named Leo, and they're all students in the Wilderness School, a boarding school for "bad kids."
